AVANCE PROGRAMS

AVANCE-San Antonio, Inc. operates two federal Head Start (HS) & Early Head Start (EHS) programs:

San Antonio dual program in Bexar County

- Head Start-San Antonio (HS-SA) is federally funded to provide center-based services to 762 children ages 3 to 5 years. HS-SA operates in partnership with Harlandale Independent School District (HISD) on an academic calendar with thirty-eight (42) classrooms, including four (4) AVANCE-only (or stand-alone) classrooms at ten (10) centers.
- Early Head Start-San Antonio (EHS-SA) is federally funded to provide services to 342 infants and toddlers at 248 center-based and 94 home-based children year-round at seven (7) centers.

Texas Winter Garden dual program operated in five Texas counties (Uvalde, Zavala, Real, Edwards, and Kinney)

- Head Start-Texas Winter Garden (HS-TXWG) is federally funded to provide center-based services to 185 children ages 3 to 5. HS-TXWG operates at five (5) centers and runs on an academic calendar.
- Early Head Start-Texas Winter Garden (EHS-TXWG) is federally funded to provide services to 196 infants and toddlers at 144 center-based and 52 home-based children year-round at nine (9) centers.

AVANCE provides health, nutrition, mental health, special needs, early childhood development and education, and family social services. Parental engagement is essential in helping families reach their highest potential!

Parent-Child Education Program (PCEP)

Our nine-month Parenting and Early Childhood Education is at the foundation of all programs offered to parents and their children from prenatal to 5 years old. Services are comprehensive and designed to enhance parents' child-rearing skills to foster their children's healthy development and ensure school readiness.

Caminos al Futuro - Pathways to the Future



TOTAL HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START



AVERAGE MONTHLY ENROLLMENT


We are pleased to see our enrollments steadily climbing back to pre-COVID levels.



HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START SERVICES

ERSEA SERVICES

AVANCE's ERSEA (Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, and Attendance) Department helps programs meet enrollment expectations by processing applications, enrollments, and recruiting in the community. ERSEA works diligently alongside the Family Community & Engagement team to contact any family whose child has been absent for more than two days consecutively. During the 2021-2022 academic school year, our centers struggled to meet an 80% or above attendance following the return to school after COVID-19 and the Uvalde tragedy.




AVANCE's Health Program Services offers enrolled families information and resources regarding their child's health and well-being. We partner with UTHSC Center Pediatric Clinic to help families obtain physicals, vaccines, hemoglobin and lead test, and other services. Our Health Literacies help families stay updated with health practices, maintain safe sleep practices, conduct virtual Post Natal Visits to help new mothers with the care they need and conduct quarterly Health Advisory meetings with community agencies and families. The Health team also promotes good oral hygiene by enabling continuous toothbrushing or helping your child brush daily and distributing oral kits containing a toothbrush and toothpaste.

The Health Team pulls monthly reports to identify if there are any needs for upcoming health/nutrition events, in partnership with community representatives, to continue making data-driven decisions to improve outcomes with medical insurance, medical/dental home, medical exams, immunizations, physical exams, height/weight, hearing/vision screenings, hemoglobin/lead test, and more.

HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START SERVICES

FAMILY & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

AVANCE's Family Engagement team helps support families in goal-setting and tracking strengths, needs, and progress toward goals and provides the necessary resources. Family Engagement collaborates with Community Partners such as Haven for Hope, H-E-B Read3, Project Quest, Harlandale ISD, San Antonio Food Bank, Family Service, and in-house Caminos al Futuro – Pathways to the Future. Family Engagement attends teacher conferences and registration events, assists with child transitioning, and encourages parents to be their child's first teacher.







EDUCATION/SCHOOL READINESS

AVANCE's Education Department aims to support children in achieving their School Readiness Goals in partnership with parents and community resource agencies by promoting, supporting, and being actively engaged in the children's learning, literacy, and wellness activities at centers and their homes. The curriculum used is TS Gold and The Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos, aligned with developing an early learning framework, Teaching Strategies Gold Objectives for Development, and The Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS).




MENTAL HEALTH & WELLNESS



Mental Health & Wellness provides home visits and consultations to parents/guardians needing support, training/workshops to staff, and children mental health activities to help recognize their feelings and regulate responses to situations.




SCHOOL READINESS GOAL OUTCOMES San Antonio Programs

Percentage of Children Who Met or Exceeded Expectations by Classroom










SCHOOL READINESS GOAL OUTCOMES Winter Garden Programs








2022 COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT SURVEY

The first area is in Bexar County, San Antonio with targeted recruitment in seven (7) local school districts including Harlandale Independent School District. The second service area is known as Texas Winter Garden which includes Edwards, Real, Kinney, Uvalde, and Zavala Counties. Texas Winter garden is a rural area with fewer resources and accessibility.


